Frederick Isasi was selected to be Families USA’s second-ever Executive Director in January 2017 because of his life-long commitment to achieving high-quality, affordable health care for all. Mr. Isasi frequently testifies in Congress and is a well-known national speaker on Medicaid, state innovation, health system transformation, behavioral health, and the social determinants of health as well as health care quality, payment, and equity issues.

Mr. Isasi’s passion for health care reform began when he was growing up in North Carolina as the son of Cuban immigrants. There, he saw firsthand many of the barriers to health care experienced by the poor, people of color, people with language barriers, and rural communities.

Before joining Families USA, Mr. Isasi served as the Health Division Director at the bipartisan National Governors Association’s (NGA) Center for Best Practices. Prior to NGA, Mr. Isasi served as Vice President for Health Policy at the Advisory Board Company where he founded its Health Policy Department. Prior to this work, Mr. Isasi served as Senior Legislative Counsel for Health Care on both the U.S. Senate Finance Committee and Senate Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions (HELP) for former Senator Jeff Bingaman (D-NM), the only Democrat serving on both committees during the creation of the Affordable Care Act.

Earlier in his career, Mr. Isasi served as a health care attorney with Powell Goldstein, where he worked closely with states on Medicaid reforms and represented public hospitals; prior to that, he served as Senior Policy Advisor to the District of Columbia Primary Care Association. Mr. Isasi holds a JD from Duke University, an M.P.H. from the University of North Carolina, and a B.S. in Cellular Biology and a second major in Spanish from the University of Wisconsin.

Joyce Leon, MD is both a medical director and physician leader who combines several disciplines and practices to bring an impactful presence to the organization, centering much of her work at Henry Ford Health System on the use of collaboration and technology to assist in patient care, with a focus on improved outcomes at lower costs. She has been instrumental in implementing a point-of-care tool for quality gap closure that includes a workflow-sensitive solution, robust reporting for outreach and monitoring progress. She is a member of several professional organizations including the American College of Physicians (ACP), American Medical Informatics Association, Healthcare Information & Management Systems Society, American Association of Physician Leaders and American Medical Women's Association. She also served as a board member for Northeast Integrated Health (formerly known as Northeast Guidance Center), a community mental health organization serving the east side of Detroit for more than 50 years.

Dr. Leon completed her internal medicine residency at Henry Ford Hospital (Detroit) in 2002, practiced with Integrated Health Associates (IHA) and rejoined Henry Ford Health System in 2013 as Medical Director of Ambulatory Practices at Henry Ford Wyandotte Hospital. She received her MD from Michigan State University, and a Master of Science in Cell and Molecular Biology from the University of Michigan. She is Board certified in Internal Medicine and Clinical Informatics. She is also a Certified Physician Executive (CPE) through the American Academy of Physician Leadership.
